### Re: COMPLAINT "UNABLE TO LOCATE RECORDS" RESPONSE DND ATIP FILE: A-2016-01255

Reference is being made to my original *Access to Information Act* request dated September 13, 2016 and the 'no records could be located' response I received from National Defence dated October 14, 2016 (copies attached). I wish to complain about the incomplete search conducted by the National Defence for the records I requested.

Also attached are copies of the following letters, each one, documenting clear orders to the Canadian Armed Forces personnel being deployed in High River during the 2013 flood, NOT TO ENGAGE IN LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITES.

- (1) Letter to Minister of National Defence dated June 21, 2013 signed by Chief of Defence Staff, General T.J. Lawson and Deputy Minister Richard B. Fadden stating in Item #3: "Canadian Armed Forces Personnel will not engage in law enforcement activities."
- (2) Letter to the Minister of Public Safety dated June 21, 2013 signed by the Minister of National Defence stating in the bottom paragraph on page one: "Canadian Armed Forces personnel will not engage in law enforcement activities."
- (3) Letter to the Chief of Defence Staff dated June 21, 2013 signed by the Minister of National Defence, Peter MacKay stating in the last paragraph on page two: "Canadian Armed Forces will not engage in law enforcement activities."
- (4) Letter to the Minister of National Defence Peter MacKay dated June 21, 2013 signed by the Minister of Public Safety Vic Toews stating on page two: "No assistance to law enforcement by the CF under subsection 272.6(2) of the National Defence Act is anticipated at this time."
- (5) Letter to the Minister of Public Safety dated June 21, 2013 signed by Douglas Griffiths, Alberta Minister of Municipal Affairs and Minister Responsible for Emergency Response stating in the second paragraph: "I do not foresee a requirement to use the CF members as peace officers, and I do not see a requirement to arm them for these humanitarian and disaster response duties."

Despite these explicit orders from the highest levels of the government and the military, **not to engage in law enforcement**, the soldiers deployed in High River for seven days in June 2013 did exactly that.

Additionally, during their deployment in High River, soldiers were ordered not to stand at road blocks or have military equipment visible at road blocks. However, as the attached RCMP picture of Canadian Armed Forces personnel proves, they were quite willing to use military equipment and participate in the seizing of firearms. How did National Defence consider manning road blocks a law enforcement activity but not the seizing of firearms?

I don't believe that such a blatant breaking of orders happened without having resulted in many meetings being held in both Ottawa headquarters and CFB Edmonton. I would appreciate getting copies of the minutes of these meetings.
