Reference is being made to the RCMP's partial to RCMP ATIP Files: A-2013-03285 and GA-1516-03285/13 dated april 14, 2014 which showed the Canadian Firearms Program for fiscal year 2013/14 cost taxpayers \$56.9 million and had the equivalent of 501 full time employees.

Reference is also being made to the federal cost of all firearms programs in 1993/94 before the Liberal Government's Bill C-68 was passed into law in 1995. The House of Commons Hansard record for June 13, 1995 which shows Total Federal Cost of \$15.5 million and 57 employees for fiscal year 1993/94.

Reference also to Parliamentary Research Branch - Gun Control Law in Canada - April 1994.

- 1. Please provide copies of the most recent cost/benefit analyses, value-for-money audits, effectiveness evaluations for the current gun control laws and programs in Canada.
- 2. Please provide copies of reports, studies, evaluations comparing the effectiveness of Canada's current gun control laws and programs with the effectiveness of the gun control programs in effect in Canada in 1994; thereby, justifying the expenditure of \$40 million tax dollars a year more and employing 440 more public servants annually than the government did twenty years ago.
- 3. Please provide copies of reports showing what the Auditor General of Canada described as unreported major additional costs for the firearms program: indicating economic costs, enforcement costs, compliance costs for law-abiding firearms owners; and costs to all federal government departments and agencies owing and using firearms and the costs to provincial, regional, and municipal governments that own and use firearms.

Based on the information provided, a search for records was conducted with Canadian Firearms Program. Unfortunately, we were unable to locate records which respond to your request.
