Proposed response to Access to Information Act request A-2015-04273 / F146

It is important to note that Public Agents Firearms Regulations provisions requiring Public Agencies to record the protected firearms that come into their possession came into force on October 31, 2008. As well, Public Agencies had until October 31, 2009 to record the firearms in their inventory to the Registrar. Data on seized firearms are not available before the coming into force of the PAFR. The above 'lead-in' or 'ramp-up' dates also explain some of the variation in the initial years (2008 and 2009) when the Regulations were coming into force.
