MEMORANDUM FOR THE MINISTER

CANADIAN FIREARMS ADVISORY COMMITTEE **MEETING MARCH 1 & 2, 2017**

(Information only)

ISSUE

You will be meeting with the Canadian Firearms Advisory Committee (CFAC) on their second day of meeting, March 2, 2017. Supporting documents are attached.

BACKGROUND

CFAC was established in July 2006, to provide advice to the Minister of Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness on legislative reform related to firearms in Canada. In 2015, the Government pledged to modify the membership of CFAC to include law enforcement officers, public health advocates, representatives from women's groups, and members of the legal community (TAB A). This is the first meeting of the newly reconstituted Committee.

CURRENT STATUS

The agenda of the meeting covers one and a half days (TAB B). Day 1 begins with a working lunch held at RCMP Headquarters on Leikin Drive, followed by a presentation by the Department of Justice (DOJ) on Canada's firearms legislative framework. Following the DOJ presentation, the RCMP's Canadian Firearms Program (CFP) will present an overview of the CFP, including:

- The responsibilities of the Registrar and Chief Firearms Officers (includes Firearms Transfers)
- Firearms Licensing and Enhanced Screening
- Firearms Classification regime
- Firearms Tracing



As part of Day one, participants will have an opportunity to view firearms from each of the classes, on display from the RCMP's firearm vault. Day one will be facilitated by officials at the RCMP.

Day two will begin with a working breakfast. The Chair of the Committee, Justice Major, will begin the second day of the meeting, and invite you to provide your remarks via videoconference call from the Ministers Regional Office (TAB C). Officials will then proceed to provide information related to Canada's current firearms control framework with a focus on the firearms related commitments made by the Government (TAB D). Emphasis has been placed on those that are most pressing, namely the Firearms Marking Regulations which come into force on June 1, 2017, and the repeal of some elements of the Common Sense Firearms Licensing Act (former Bill C-42) highlighted in the mandate letter. CFAC members will also have an opportunity to raise any issues regarding firearms that they would like to bring to your attention. Officials from Public Safety Canada will facilitate the second day of the meeting. Representatives from your office are also intending to attend.

Your office has indicated that you will join the meeting at the end of the information session, at 1:30 p.m., to receive the comments and advice of the committee on these matters.

NEXT STEPS

You will be addressing the Committee at 9:30 a.m. and at 1:30 p.m. on March 2, 2017. Your talking points are attached (**TAB E**).



ISSUE

Further to the Minister's correspondence of May 26, 2016, addressed to the Honourable John C. (Jack) Major, your signature is required to a follow-up letter (TAB A) regarding his travel accommodations and expenses, the Department's security requirements and his acceptance of the Canadian Firearms Advisory Committee (CFAC) Terms of Reference, which are required to be approved by the Minister, prior to being sent.

BACKGROUND

As you know, Justice Major has agreed to Chair CFAC. The previous correspondence sent to him by the Minister explained the purpose and mandate of the Committee as well as requested his input on the list of possible Vice-Chair candidates, committee members and the draft CFAC Terms of Reference. We have been informed by the Minister's office that Justice Major did not provide any feedback.

This new correspondence confirms that he is entitled to Business Class air travel and other expenditures as indicated in the Treasury Board Air Travel Authority for Executive Group (TAB B). It must be noted that Justice Major is considered part of the Executive Group due to his status as a judge. It is also recommended that you obtain the Minister's approval of the final Terms of Reference (**TAB C**) prior to sending the letter to Justice Major.



In order to address CFAC security requirements, I would request that you please complete the highlighted sections in the attached Personnel Screening Consent and Authorization Form.



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

1. Section A (Administrative Information) Authorized Departmental/Agency/Organizational Official

The Official, based on instructions issued by the Departmental Security Officer, may be responsible for determining, based on five year background history, what constitutes sufficient verification of personal data, educational and professional qualifications, and employment history. References are to be limited to those provided on the application for employment or equivalent forms.

SUPPLEMENTAL INFORMATION REQUIREMENTS

Persons who presently hold a SECURITY CLEARANCE and subsequently marry, remarry or commence a common-law partnership, in addition to having to update sections of the Security Clearance Form (TBS/SCT 330-60), are required to submit an original Personnel Screening, Consent and Authorization Form, with the following parts completed:

Part A - As set forth in each question

Part B - As set forth in each question, excluding CRIMINAL CONVICTIONS IN AND OUTSIDE OF CANADA.

Part C - Applicant's signature and date only are required

"Other". This should be used to identify if the security screening is for Site Access, NATO, SIGINT etc.

2. Section B (Biographical Information)

To be completed by the applicant. If more space is required use a separate sheet of paper (1226-MS-177E). Each sheet must be signed.

Country of Birth - For "NEW" requests, if born abroad of Canadian parents, please provide a copy of your Certificate of Registration of Birth Abroad. If you arrived in Canada less than five years ago, provide a copy of the Immigration Visa, Record of Landing document or a copy of passport.

- List only criminal convictions for which a pardon has NOT been granted. Include on a separate attached sheet of paper (1226-MS-177E), if more than one conviction. Applicant must include those convictions outside Canada.
- Offences under the National Defence Act are to be included as well as convictions by courts-martial are to be recorded.

3. Section C (Consent and Verification)

A copy of Section "C" may be released to institutions to provide acknowledgement of consent.

Criminal record checks (fingerprints may be required) and credit checks are to be arranged through the Departmental Security Office or the delegated Officer.

Consent: may be given only by an applicant who has reached the age of majority, otherwise, the signature of a parent or guardian is mandatory.

The age of majority is:

19 years in NFLD., N.S., N.B., B.C., Yukon, Northwest Territories and Nunavut;

18 years in P.E.I., Que., Ont., Man., Sask. and Alta.

The applicant will provide initials in the "applicant's initials box".

The official who carried out the verification of the Information will print their name, insert their initials and telephone number in the required space.

- Reliability Screening (for all types of screening identified within Section A): complete numbers 1 and 2 and 3 if applicable.
- Security Clearance (for all types of screening identified within Section A): complete numbers 1 to 4 and 5 where applicable.
- Other: number 5 is used only where prior Treasury Board of Canada Secretariat approval has been obtained.

4. Section D (Review)

To be completed by authorized Departmental/Agency/Organizational Official who is responsible for ensuring the completion of sections A to C as requested.

5. Section E (Approval)

Authorized Departmental/Agency/Organizational Security Official refers to the individuals as determined by departments, agencies, and organizations that may verify reliability information and/or approve/not approve reliability status and/or security clearances. Approved Reliability Status and Level I, II and III, as well as the signature of the authorized security official or manager are added for Government of Canada use only. Applicants are to be briefed, acknowledge, and be provided with a copy of the "Security Screening Certificate and Briefing Form (TBS/SCT 330-47)".

Note: Private sector organizations do not have the authority to approve any level of security screening.

Photographs: Departments/Agencies/Organizations are responsible for ensuring that three colour photographs of passport size are attached to the form for the investigating agency. Maximum dimensions are 50mm x 70mm and minimum are 43mm x 54mm. The face length from chin to crown of head must be between 25mm x 35mm. The photographs must be signed by the applicant and an authorized security official. The photographs must have been taken within the last six months. It is required for new or upgrade Level III security clearances for identification of the applicant during the security screening investigation by the investigating agency. The investigating agency may in specific incidents request a photograph for a Level I or II clearances when an investigation is required.

Canadian Firearms Advisory Committee Terms of Reference

PURPOSE

To advise the Minister of Public Safety on pragmatic measures to reform Canada's firearms policies, laws and regulations to ensure a modernized firearms regime that will keep Canadians safe.

COMPOSITION

The Committee will consist of up to 15 members. It will include individuals who are civilian firearms users, knowledgeable law enforcement officers, public health advocates, representatives from women's groups, and members of the legal community.

Members serve in their own right and not as representatives or delegates of their host organization. Consequently, substitutes will not be accepted.

Public Safety Canada may invite observers from appropriate government departments and agencies as well as subject matter experts to support a specific agenda item under discussion. Public Safety Canada will serve as the Secretariat for the Committee.

A representative of the RCMP Canadian Firearms Program will sit on the Committee as an ex-officio member.

The Minister will appoint two members to serve as both Chair and Vice-Chair, respectively, of the Committee. The Chair will serve as the Committee's spokesperson. The Vice-Chair will serve in the capacity of Chair, if the Chair is unable to carry out his/her functions.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

Any member participating in this committee in his or her own personal capacity agrees for the duration of his or her term as member of this committee not to:

- 1. Participate in any contractual process, competitive or otherwise, involving Public Safety Canada:
- 2. Apply for or accept receipt of any monies obtained through a Grant or Contribution Agreement involving Public Safety Canada; and
- 3. Engage directly or indirectly in any lobbying activities or work as a lobbyist in any capacity on behalf of any entity making submissions or representation to the Government of Canada.

TERMS OF APPOINTMENT

Under the authority provided for in section 6 of the *Department of Public Safety and Emergency Preparedness Act*, the Minister is empowered to establish advisory and other committees and provide for their membership, duties, functions, and operation. The committees serve at the Minister's pleasure, and the Minister may at any time:

- extend the service of members of a Committee;
- appoint new members to the Committee;
- remove members from the Committee; or
- disband a Committee.

Each of the Canadian Firearms Advisory Committee members will be appointed by the Minister and will serve on the Committee during pleasure for such term not exceeding two years. Violation of these terms and conditions will be grounds for immediate removal from the Committee. Members may also be removed from the Committee at any time at the Minister's sole discretion. Members whose tenure has expired may be eligible for re-appointment.

In order to enhance the effectiveness of their work, all members will undergo the background checks required to receive a security clearance of Enhanced Reliability as per the Government Security Policy.

LOCATION AND FREQUENCY OF MEETINGS

Meetings will be held in Ottawa or as decided by the Minister. The frequency of meetings will be determined by the Minister. It is anticipated that there will be at least one in-person meeting per year.

Subcommittees or working groups may be formed as necessary. The input of Committee members may be sought by the Minister's Office or other Government officials as required.

Members have access to teleconference services provided by Public Safety Canada to facilitate their planning and to hold subcommittee or working group meetings.

AGENDAS AND MATERIALS

The agenda will be determined by the Minister, while including the opportunity for members to identify emerging issues in the firearms regime. The agenda, and any required documentation, will be distributed to Members one week prior to the meeting.

All documentation prepared by Public Safety Canada will be available in both official languages and all members are invited to express themselves in the official language of their choice.

The Committee will be responsible for preparing a record of discussion after each meeting.

COMMUNICATIONS

In order to allow for frank and open discussion of important issues, there will be no public communication regarding deliberations of the Committee. No member, other than the Chair or Vice-Chair when acting in the Chair's capacity, may speak to the media on behalf of the Committee. Members who choose to speak to the media as part of a bona fide occupational requirement must make clear that they are speaking for themselves or their employer, and not on behalf of the Committee.

REIMBURSEMENT

Committee members are entitled to reimbursement for reasonable travel expenses in accordance with Treasury Board policy. Expenses will be listed in the Letter of Agreement sent to members prior to each meeting.

Special Travel Authorities

6. Executive Group

6.1 General

- 1. The Executive Group includes EXs (but not those in "equivalent" occupational groups or in acting positions) as well as employees in the following groups and levels and above:
 - ©X, LA-2, Sub-level B; LA-3, Sub-levels A, B and C; MD-MOF-4 and 5 exclusions; MD-MSP-3; PM-MCO-4; DS-7A, 7B and 8 exclusions; and
 - Governor-in-Council Appointees whose terms of travel are not otherwise specified on appointment.
- 2. The above-mentioned groups are subject to the terms and conditions of the *Travel Directive*. In addition, during normal business trips away from the vicinity of the headquarters area (excluding weekends home, extended travel, relocations and expenses related to guests, which automatically fall under hospitality), the following flexibility apply.

6.2 Meals

- 1. Claims may include the daily meal allowances or actual and reasonable meal expenses based on receipts. When actual expenses are claimed for a given meal (based on receipts), meal allowances are applicable to other meals purchased that day (and no receipts are required).
- 2. Actual meal expenses shall not include alcohol, costs associated with guests or co-workers, or the additional cost of room service, which is to be identified by the claimant. Employees must submit the actual bill for their own meal, rather than claim a bill that covers a number of people, except under the *Hospitality Policy*.

6.3 Incidentals

- The incidental allowance covers such items as laundry, dry cleaning, gratuities, a daily newspaper, luggage depreciation over the duration of a trip, even though a particular expense may be higher on a given day.
- 2. Whenever actual and reasonable expenses are claimed, the Travel Expense Claim must include a brief statement describing why the meal or incidental allowances were inadequate under the specific circumstances.
- 3. The incidental allowance is cumulative. For example, with respect to laundry and dry cleaning costs, even though such expenses are unlikely to occur before day three, the allowance is provided on a daily basis so that when a dry cleaning expense is incurred, the employee has the necessary funds to cover the cost.

- 4. Actual incidental costs may be claimed in unusual circumstances. However, if one decides to claim actual incidental costs instead of the pre-determined incidental allowance, then all incidental expenses reimbursements incurred on that trip will be on the basis of receipts.
- It is recommended that the claims of employees who qualify under the Executive Group be flagged for easy retrieval should the Treasury Board Secretariat request an internal audit.

64 Texts and parking

On examight business trips away from the vicinity of the headquarters area, actual expenses may be defined for texts and parking, based on the honour system (without receipts). Receipts may be submitted if preferred.

6.5 Hotels

The Accommodation and Car Rental Directory no longer lists properties on white or green pages. Accommodations are now listed by the equivalent, as within the city rate limit or above the city rate limit. As a result of changes from the Budget of February 25, 1992, accommodation above the city limit rate must be justified on the travel claim. Selection of such properties should be because it is cost-effective or because exceptional circumstances warrant.

6.6 Calls home

- 1. For travel in Canada and continental USA, home communication is included in the new revised incidental expense allowance.
- 2. For international travel, the regular telephone provisions of the *Travel Directive* apply when inter-city authorization codes are not provided or cannot be used because cities are not linked to this network, as is often the case for overseas travel.
- 3. When inter-city authorization codes are provided and may be used, executives should use them and not separately claim the cost of telephone calls home. Executives are asked to exercise discretion in their use of this facility as to the frequency and duration of calls home.

6.7 Business class air

1. The February 25, 1992 Budget specified that Deputy Heads will manage a reduction in the use of business class travel. The reduction refers to air travel outside the terms of article 3.4.11 of the *Travel Directive* which is covered by a collective agreement. It includes travel by the Executive Group, Governor-in-Council appointees, and other situations where business class could be individually authorized.

- 2. The Treasury Board authorized the use of business class air travel for trips of 850 air kilometres or more one way by the following groups and levels, and above:
- o conside the NGR: EX-1, LA-2A, PM+MCO 4, GC3 and CCQ3,
- in the National Capital Region: by EX-2, GX, LA-2B, excluded MD-MOF-4, MD-MSP-3, DS-7A, GC4 and GCQ4 as well as to equivalent senior RCMP and military personnel.

Note:

- first class travel was eliminated by Cabinet direction on February 25, 1992;
- upgrades to business class do not apply for relocations and weekend travel home (when returning to the duty travel location immediately following the weekend);
- where business or executive class is unavailable, economy (or reduced) fares are to be used. This authority does not provide for the reimbursement of first class air travel;
- this authority does not entitle persons accompanying the above to upgrade their fare at the employer's cost.
