SUMMARY OF FIVE YEARS OF INTERCEPTS OF PRIVATE COMMUNICATIONS 2012-2016

Total Audio and Video Intercept Authorizations Given and Renewed = 28,001

Total Proceedings Commenced = 677

Total Number of Charges = 826

Total Number of Convictions = 570

Criminal Code section 185(1): Sets out the procedure for the procedure and criteria for granting authorizations to intercept private communications.

Criminal Code section 184.4: Authorizes warrantless interception of private communications in exigent circumstances where the authorization could not be obtained with reasonable diligence, there are reasonable grounds to believe that interception is necessary to prevent an unlawful act and would cause serous harm and one of the parties to the communication is the person who would commit the unlawful act or is the intended victim.

Criminal Code section 195: Requires an annual report on the number and content of applications made for authorizations to intercept private communications under section 185(1) to be tabled in Parliament.

Criminal Code section 196: Provides that those persons, whose private communications have been intercepted pursuant to an authorization, be notified that they may have been th3e object of such an interception.

Pursuant to section 195 of the *Criminal Code*, please find enclosed statistics relevant to the RCMP that are to be tabled before Parliament.

As you are aware, these statistics are to be combined with those of the other police agencies that report their information directly to the Police and Law Enforcement Policy Directorate of Public Safety Canada.

Of note, new accountability measures were implemented for section 184.4 (Immediate Interception–Imminent Harm), which resulted in changes to section 195 (Annual Report). There have been no such interceptions initiated by the RCMP since its inception.
